Higher education (also know simply as HE) is the level of education you can undertake after you have completed post-16 studies (such as A levels, T Levels, and BTECs).

You might study a HE course at a university, in a further education college or with an online provider. Each higher education provider offers different subjects, so there's plenty to choose from.


